

# *Projects Funded*2018-2019

- Amazing Science Adventure All fourth-grade students from Danville District 118 participated in a CSI Learning Lab at the Chicago Museum of Science and Industry. This was a partnership with Danville School District 118.
- Schoolwide Assembly featuring Tim Ryan This assembly for Danville High School and Kenneth D. Bailey
  Academy focused on the dangers of the opioid crisis.
- My Life Online Schoolwide Assembly This schoolwide assembly for all District 118 fifth-grade and sixth-grade students focused on the safe use of social media.
- A Walk Through History with Virtual Reality A Classroom Grant for Danville High School providing a classroom set of virtual reality goggles and support equipment.
- St. Louis Symphony Project This Classroom Grant supported Garfield Elementary School efforts to send a select group of students to perform with the St. Louis Symphony. The Foundation purchased recorders for the participating students.
- Assistive Tech Library This partnership with Danville School District 118 provided funding to establish a "Tech" Library in support of Special Education students.
- Graphic Calculator Loan Program This project funded graphic calculators for Danville High School's library making calculators available for students who could not afford to purchase one.
- Fine Arts Showcase and Artist in Residence This grant funded a districtwide Fine Arts Showcase and hosted an artist in residence.
- VersaTile Project A grant that funded VersaTiles for the entire Northeast Magnet School.
- Sound Recording Equipment A grant that provided sound recording equipment in support of Danville High School's choral, band and orchestra programs.
- Evening of Singing and Dancing The amazing talent of the students performing in the show choirs from Danville High School, North Ridge Middle School and South View Upper Elementary School were showcased.
- Dr. David L. Fields Excellence in Teaching Awards.
